"There is so much work that has to be done to save the dogs and much of the native wildlife over there," Mr Lemon said.


"We have established a sanctuary to rehabilitate injured animals and we're working with local community members to find alternatives to the killing."

Impressed by Mr Lemon's work, U3A members agreed to make a contribution to the conservation work in Zimbabwe.

Mr Lemon said he would use the donation from the U3A members to put toward the purchase of a protective anti-snare/tracking collar for the painted hunting dogs.

The heavy-duty lightweight collars cost about \$500 each.
