Zoo curator has passion for savannah dogs

John Lemon's love of the African painted dog meant he would return to Namibia, despite losing his passports, money and camera equipment to thieves on his last trip.

As vice-chairman of Painted Dog Conservation Incorporated (PDC), Mr Lemon works extensively to protect the endangered painted dog, also known as the African wild dog, which is threatened by man's expansion into previously uninhabited ar-

A resident of Canning Vale and curator at Perth Zoo, he has travelled to Africa repeatedly to aid in conservation efforts.

On his latest trip to Namibia in July, he spent the entire time trailing a single pack of the painted dogs with native trackers and another member of PDC.

"The dogs have the largest home range of any land animal - 3200 kilometres per pack," he said.

'We were just following footprints mainly, days on days, from 4.30 in the morning until sundown.

"We drove to all the rural villages asking if they've seen dogs, how long ago, how

many and what direction, and we finally zoned in on a pack."

They then darted and attached a radio collar to one of the young males, which allowed them to track the pack electroni-

"It was the fourth dog in 10 years to be collared, and the second pack in history,"

The painted dog is arguably Africa's most persecuted carnivore, according to

Mr Lemon. "Numbers these days range between 2500" to 3000.

"They're persecuted by humans, especially farmers, as they're seen as a threat to livestock."

Mr Lemon said one of the aims of PDC was to raise awareness of the painted dog. "You only conserve what you love, and you only love what you understand."

The conservation group will hold an African night fundraising dinner on September 21 at
